Ealing Croquet Club (ECC)

Members Code of Conduct

1. Equality and Diversity

At ECC we strive to be an inclusive and welcoming community to members from all backgrounds and walks of life. Please always show respect and courtesy to your fellow members, guests and visitors to the site.

Please refer any enquiries from passers-by to secretary@ealingcroquet.org and if you have one to hand please give them an ECC business card (cards are kept in the Pavilion and in the display box at the car gates).

2. Games in progress and play

Be aware of games in progress and avoid interfering in any way. Do not walk across a lawn when people are playing – walk around the edge and do not walk in front of the line of sight of a player during their stroke. Please wait until they have played before walking on.

3. Club equipment

Please return all club mallets, balls and equipment to the mallet cupboard and storage box at the end of your game. If your mallet is particularly wet then please wipe the head down before putting it back in the cupboard.

If you notice any mallets or equipment that are damaged, broken and in need of repair then please place them next to the fridge downstairs and notify a member of the committee or coaching team.

4. Moving around the site

The steps up to the first floor in the pavilion are quite steep and narrow. Please adhere to the warning notices and always hold the handrail.

The site used to be a bowling club and the three lawns are surrounded by ditches. It's never a good idea to walk backwards on a croquet lawn but it's particularly important not to do so when near the edge of the courts to avoid tripping over or falling into one of the ditches.

Please access the lawns using the steps or the ramps. To access the far lawn (lawn 3) please proceed along the side of lawn 2 and you'll see steps down to a paved area and then down onto the lawn. Please don't jump onto or off the small walls surrounding the ditches. Some of the paving stones surrounding the lawns may be broken and some areas and steps can be uneven so please take care if you're walking on these areas; it's safer to walk on the edge of the lawns.

Please make sure that any guests you bring with you to the club are aware of these points.

5. Keys and locking up

Members' keys are provided only for playing croquet or club organised activities. Any other use requires permission from the Trustees or committee and must be covered by appropriate arrangements and insurance.

The last person to leave the club should ensure that all lights and taps are off. Please ensure all hoops, pegs, balls and club mallets have been returned to the storage in the pavilion, and locked with the padlocks. Please check there is no-one upstairs in the pavilion before you lock up. Make sure that both doors to the pavilion and the white room are locked, and lock the pedestrian gate with the padlock if you are the last to leave.

6. Rubbish and cleaning up

Please do not put food waste in the bins at the club. Please take any food waste home or put it in a park bin. Please sweep up and remove any food crumbs from tables and the floor. Any food waste very quickly attracts mice. If you accidentally spill or break anything please use the cleaning products which are located by the sinks to clean up after yourself.

The club does not have a cleaner. Please help us to keep it clean!

7. Dogs

Well behaved dogs are welcome on site but please make sure they are not interrupting any games or causing other nuisance and keep them on a lead if necessary.

8. Under 18's

Children and young people (under 18 years old) are not allowed on site unless they are accompanied by a responsible adult (the adult does not have to play) or are part of a club organised croquet session led by one of our club coaching team.
